Brentford Community Council (BCC) is an independent organisation that was established in 1989 with start-up support from Hounslow Borough Council. Since 1999 we have been financially independent, funded by donations from organisations and individuals across the community.

The BCC is co-ordinated by a Management Group that meets before or after Planning Consultation Committee meetings. The group is open to anyone who would like to get actively involved in the BCC or would like to bring an issue to our attention.

A representative voice for Brentford

Our mission is to represent the general interests of the area with any person or agency providing services or undertaking activities affecting the local environment and well-being of people living in the area. We are non-party political.

We are frequently consulted by the local media to provide a voice for the concerns and aspirations of Brentford people.

Encouraging Sustainable Development

Successful development means balancing economic, social and environmental demands. Determining the right balance is a complex challenge. We believe that by bringing together

as diverse a range of people as possible, and giving them the opportunity to voice their opinion, we can achieve the best future for Brentford.

Making connections across the community

Planning Consultation

Since we were first established, BCC has proved itself to be a vocal watchdog of local development plans. We review over 100 local planning applications every year. These are assessed on numerous criteria from the aesthetic and regulatory to wider social, economic and environmental concerns. We whole heartedly support many developments, but with others we put forward our members' ideas to suggest how they might be improved.

Planning meetings usually take place at the Methodist Church Hall, Clifden Rd, Brentford TW8 0PD. They start at 7.15pm and fall on Thursday evenings. The dates are set on an annual basis to precede the meetings of Hounslow Borough Council's Sustainable Development Committee.
